Agenda Title: Commissioner Introduction and Election of Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Water Conservation Commission

Staff Recommendation: The Commission select a Chairperson and Vice Chairperson.

Background: 5-Year Strategic Plan, Goal 1.7 - Review and update our water conservation program - We recognize that drinking water is one of the most precious resources on earth. We will assign this to the Water Conservation committee to review and update our water conservation program to ensure we are appropriately managing our water sources.

Discussion/Analysis: The Procedures for the Water Conservation Commission state that a Chairperson and Vice Chairperson will be elected annually. Therefore, the Commissioners chosen as Chairperson and Vice Chairperson in February 2020 will serve through December 2020.

To elect a Chairperson, any Commissioner shall make a nomination recommending a Commissioner for Chair. Once the nomination is made, another Commissioner shall second the nomination. If there is no second to the nomination, the nomination fails, and a Commissioner may make a substitute nomination. Once a nomination is made and seconded, there must be at least a majority of the Commission (3 of the 5 votes) in favor of the nomination. Repeat the nomination protocol for the Vice Chairperson position.

Prior to the election, staff recommends that each Commissioner (starting alphabetically with the first name) introduce themselves, provide a brief background, and express any interest they may have in either the Chairperson or Vice Chairperson position.

The duty of the Chairperson is to run the meeting, and in the Chairperson's absence, the Vice Chairperson will run the meeting.

Subject: Receive an Update on the Length of New Commissioner Terms and Changes to the Water Conservation Commission Membership Table

Summary: In August 2018, the Board approved the restructure of the Water Conservation Commission. As part of the restructure, the number of positions on the Commission was reduced from ten to five Commissioners.

Commissioners normally serve two-year terms. But, to have staggered appointments every two years, the Board of Directors chose two Commissioners, in Positions #4 and 5, to serve initial three-year terms ending in December of 2021. After those initial 3 terms end, those positions will revert to two-year terms.

The latest version of the Water Conservation Commission Membership Table has been updated to show the term ending dates for the five commission seats. As the Board of Directors fills vacant positions #1 and #4, the table will be updated and presented again to show the Commissioners names and their corresponding term ending dates.

Subject: Receive Updated Gallons Per Capita Day (GPCD), Water Production, and Water Consumption Data

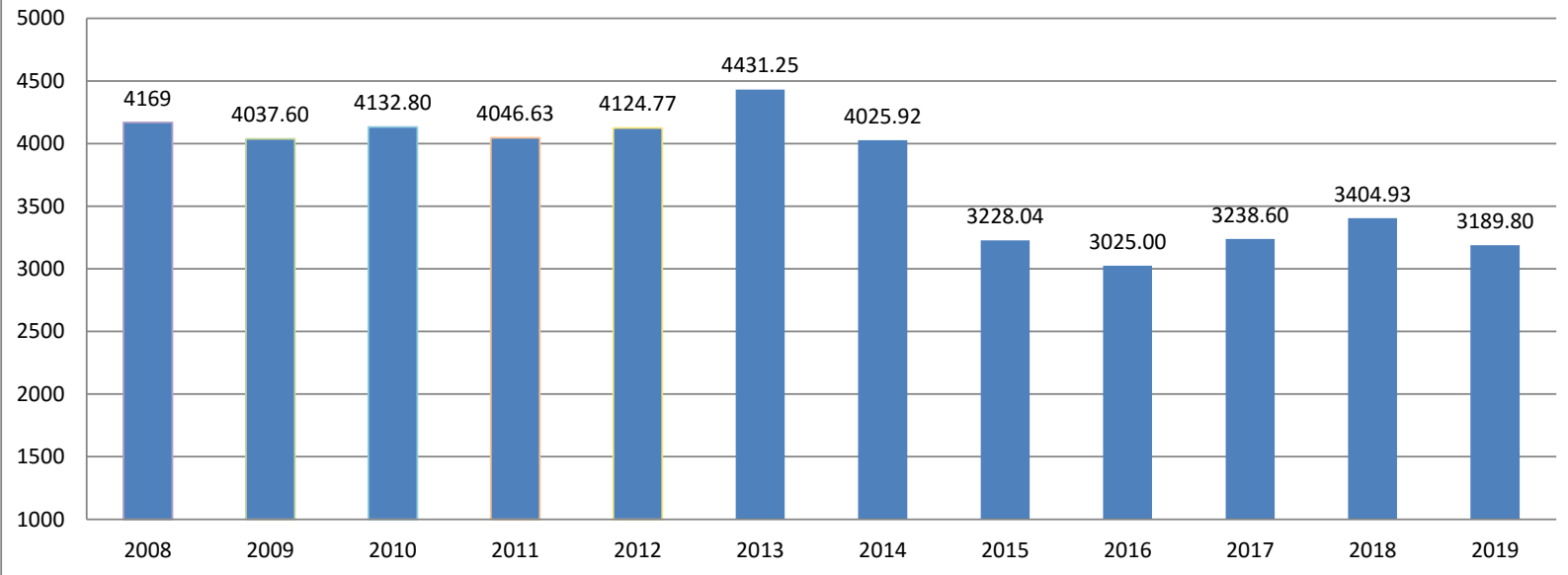
Summary: In 2014, responding to the ongoing drought, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) approved a temporary emergency regulation that directed water purveyors to electronically report monthly water production and consumption figures. Also requested by the SWRCB, at that time, was an estimate of the amount of water used each day by residential customers. This estimate, called “residential gallons per capita per day”, or R-GPCD, accurately represents water use by individuals and allows communities to compare their water use reduction efforts accurately with others around the state.

Although this reporting is only voluntary at this time, Marina Coast Water District staff continues to support the SWRCB efforts to compile and submit water production, R-GPDC data, and other required monitoring reports each month.

Included in this report are tables and charts that show water production figures through December 2019. Also included are tables and charts showing the gallons-per-capita-day (GPCD) and R-GPCD data that has been compiled. The documents are entitled:

2008-2019 Well Production by Year (acre-feet)

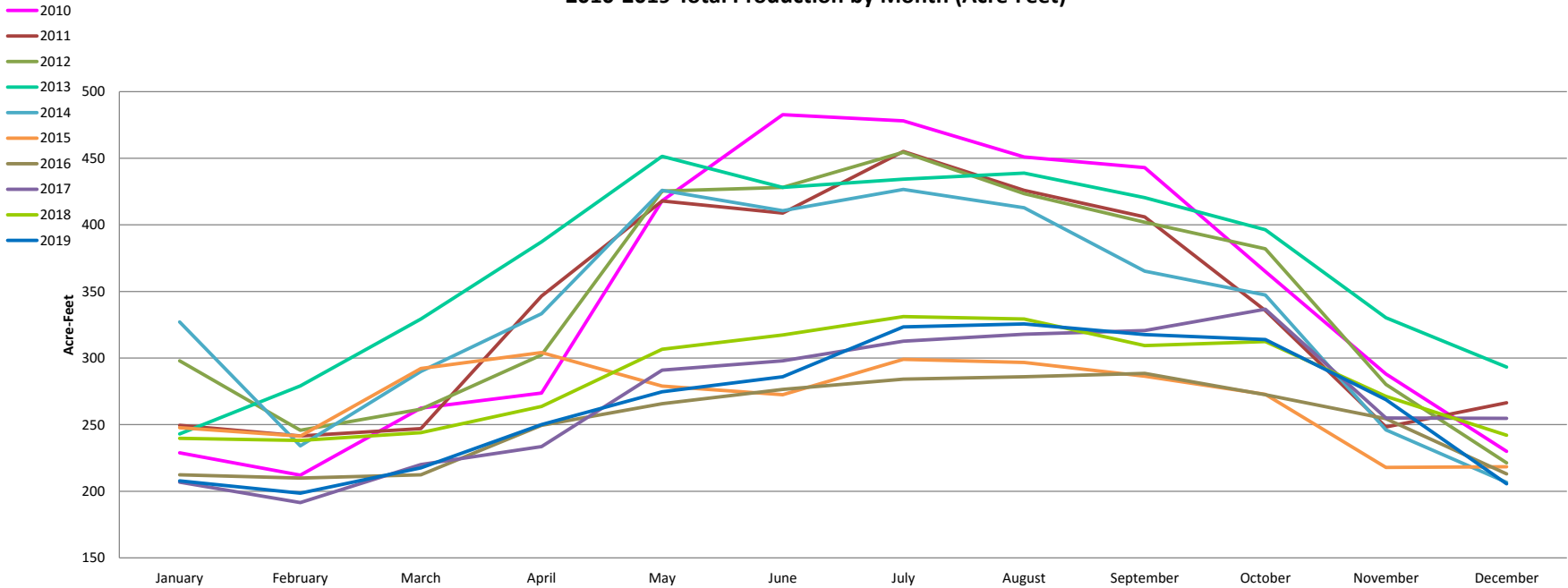

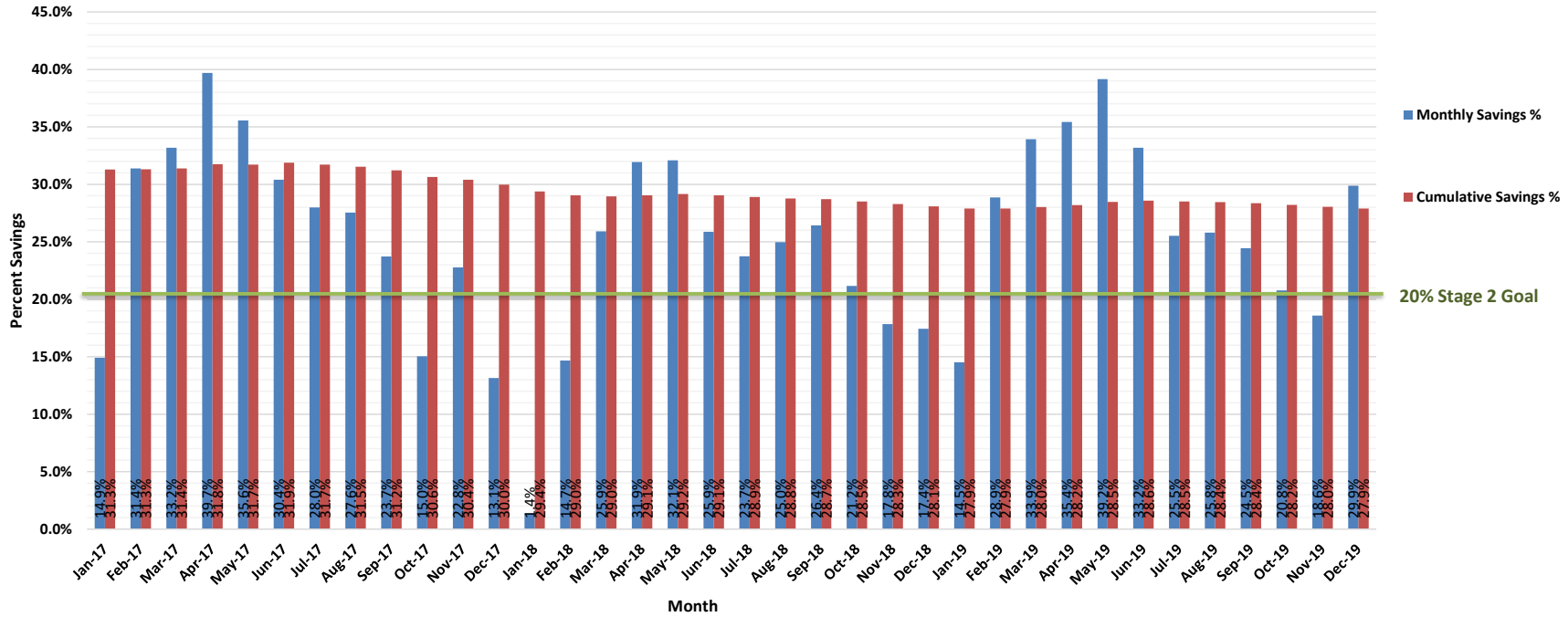

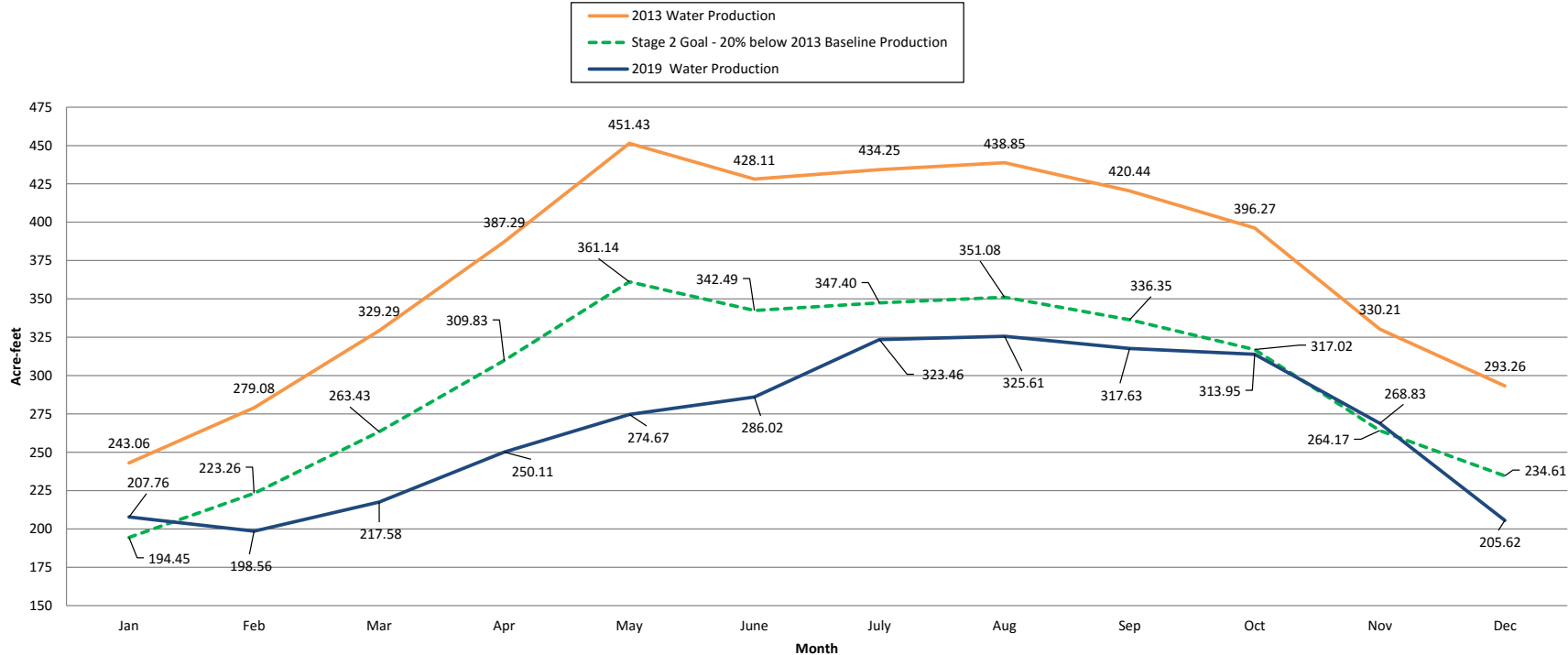
2010-2019 Total Production by Month (Acre-Feet)



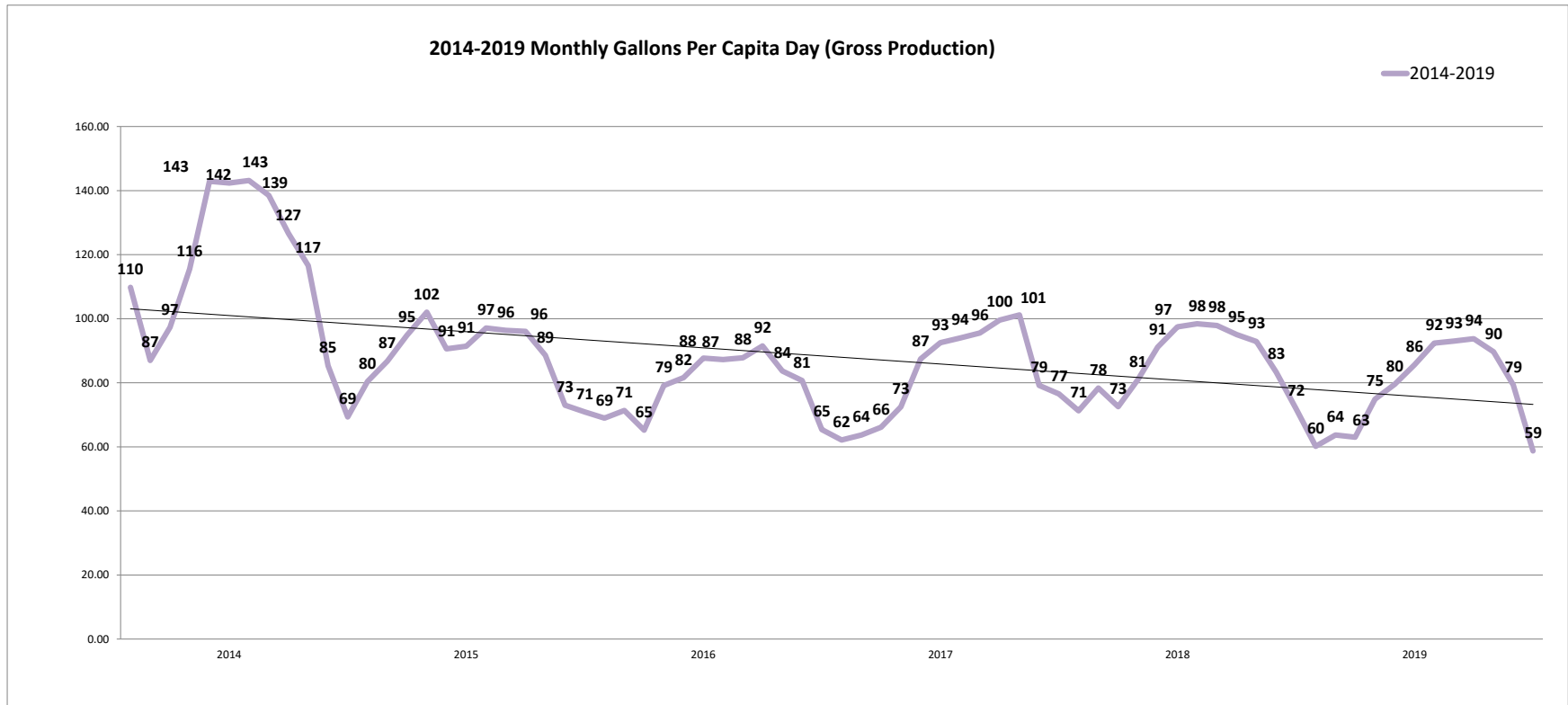
Monthly Production Savings and Cumulative Savings Compared to 2013 Only January 2017 to Current Month Shown



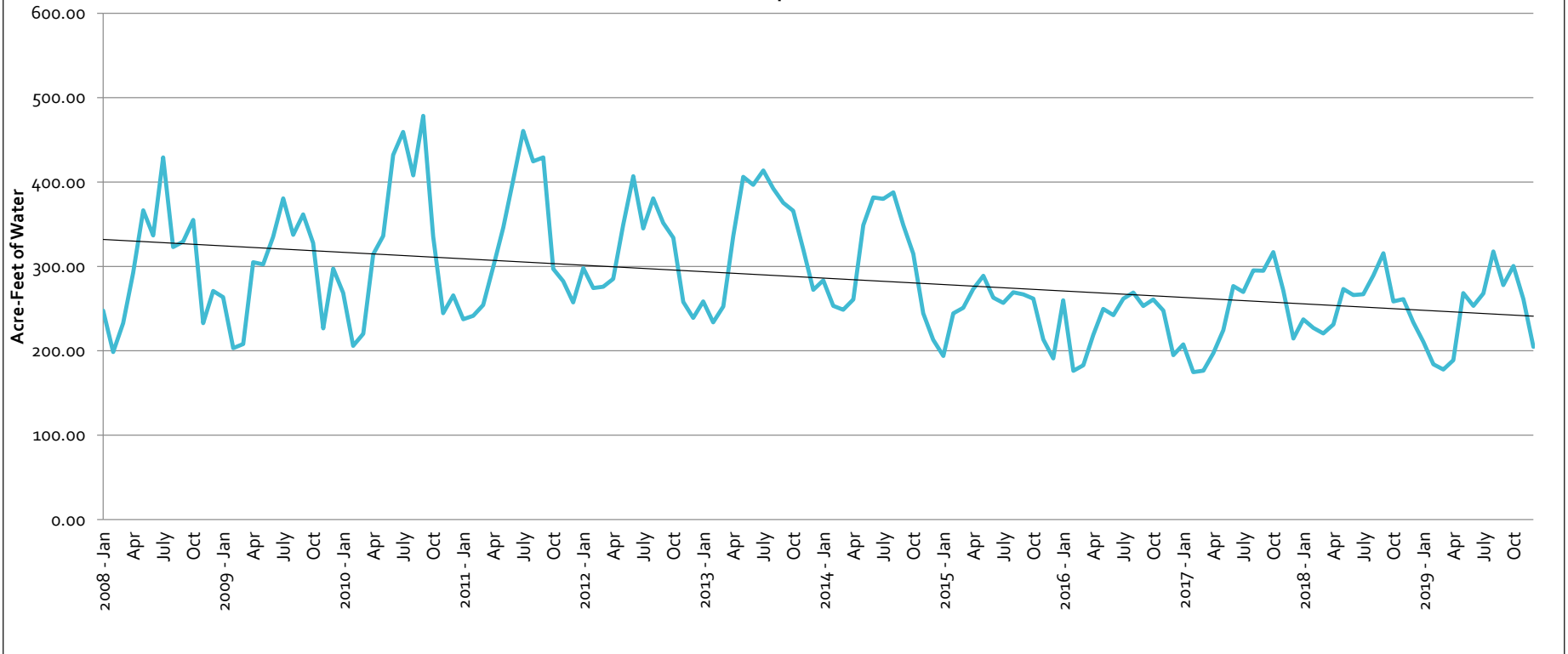
2019 Production VS. Water Production Reduction Goals



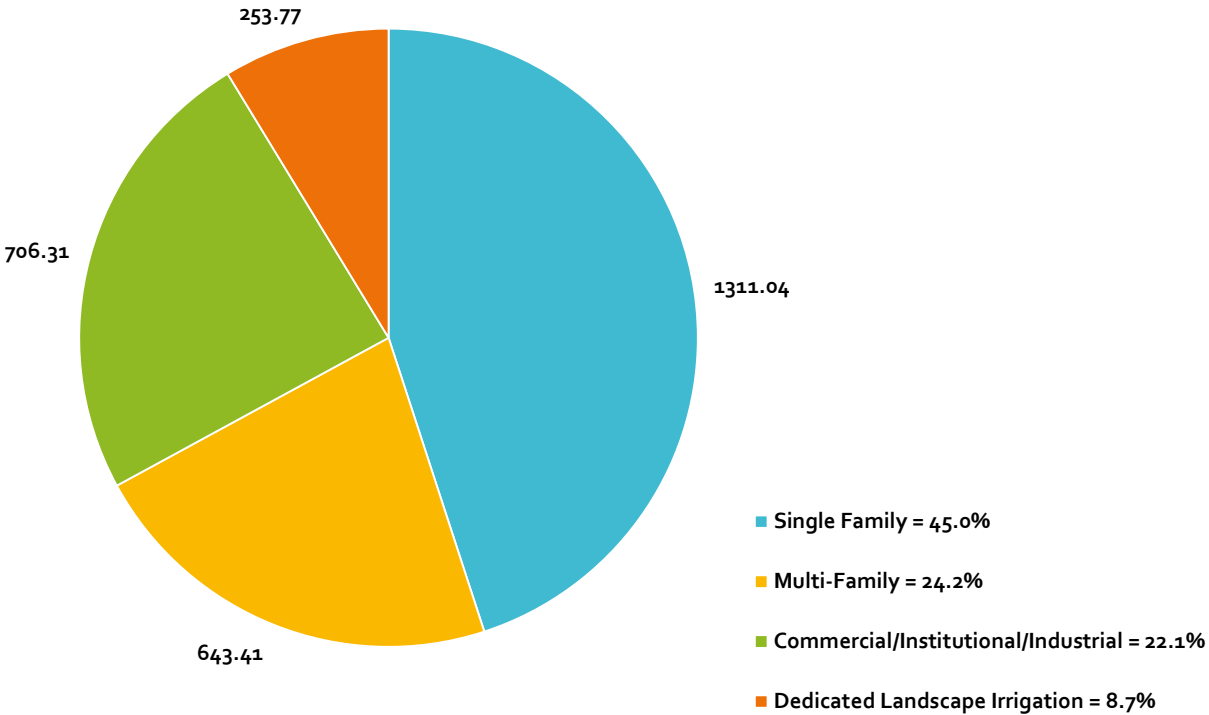

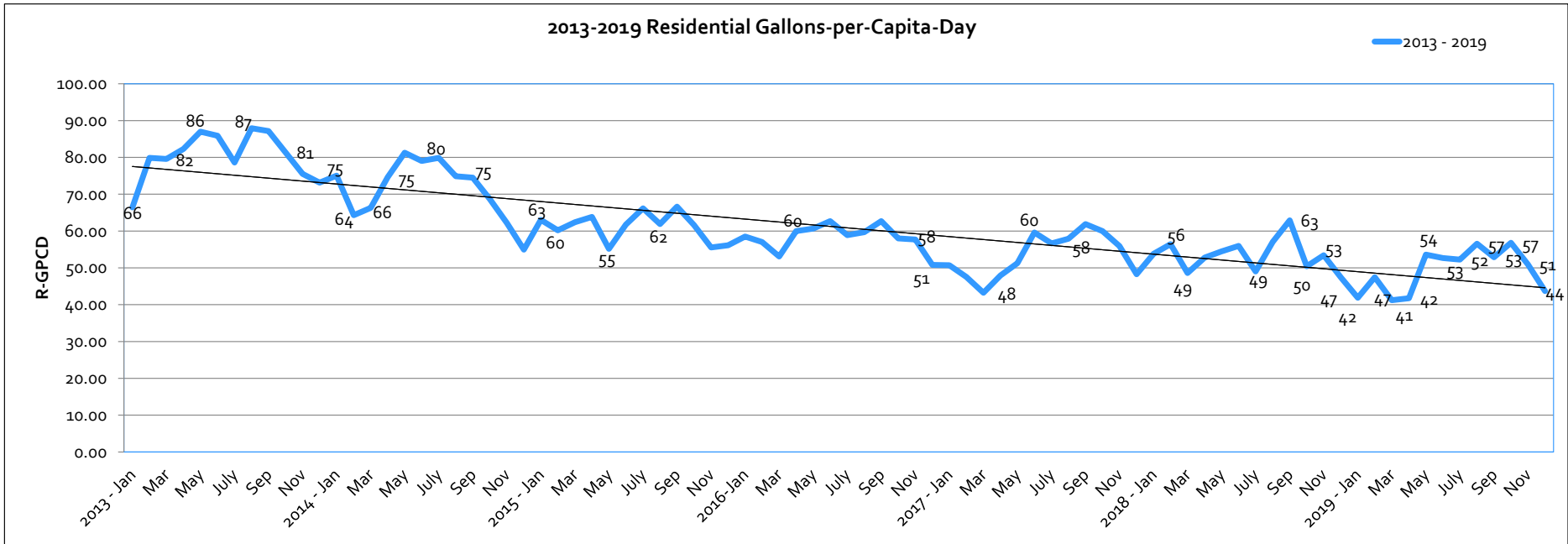


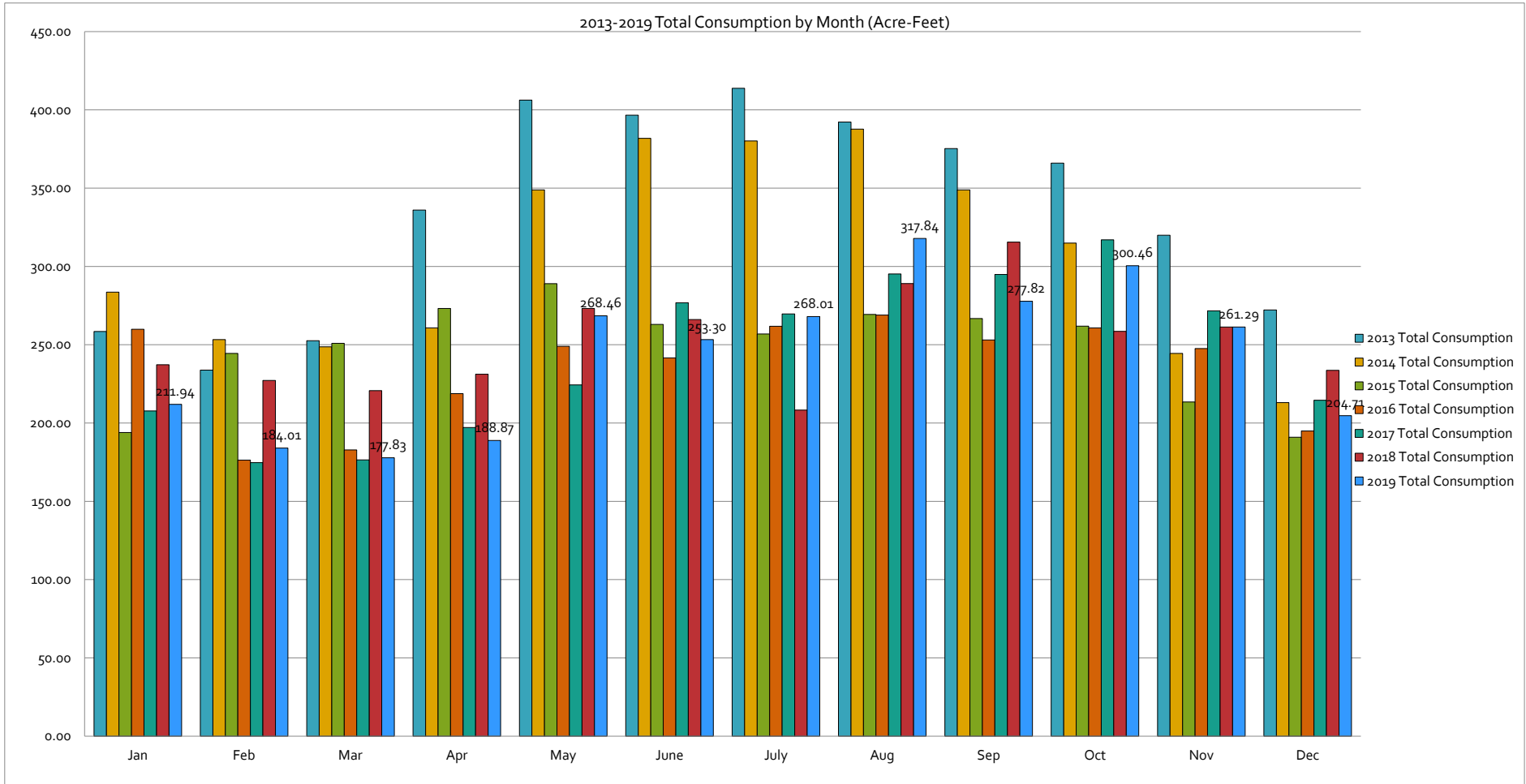
2008 - 2019
Total Billed Consumption (Acre-Feet)



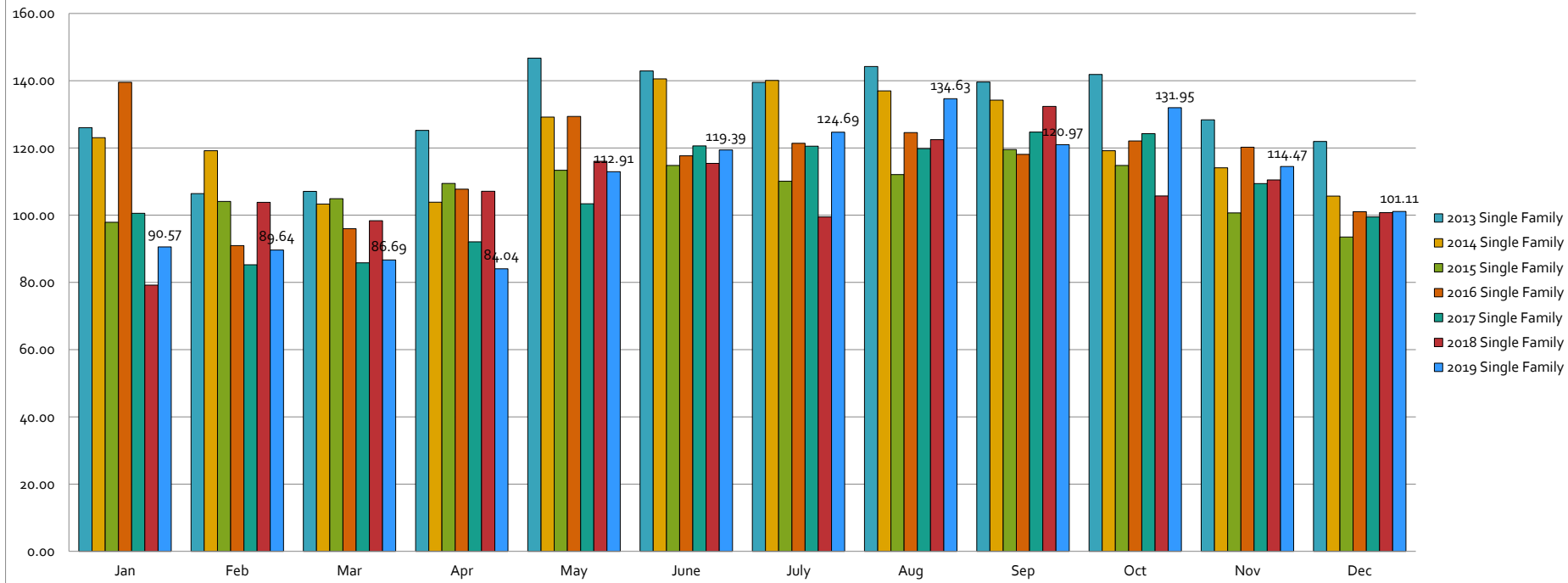
Total Billed Consumption 2019 (2914.53 Acre-Feet)



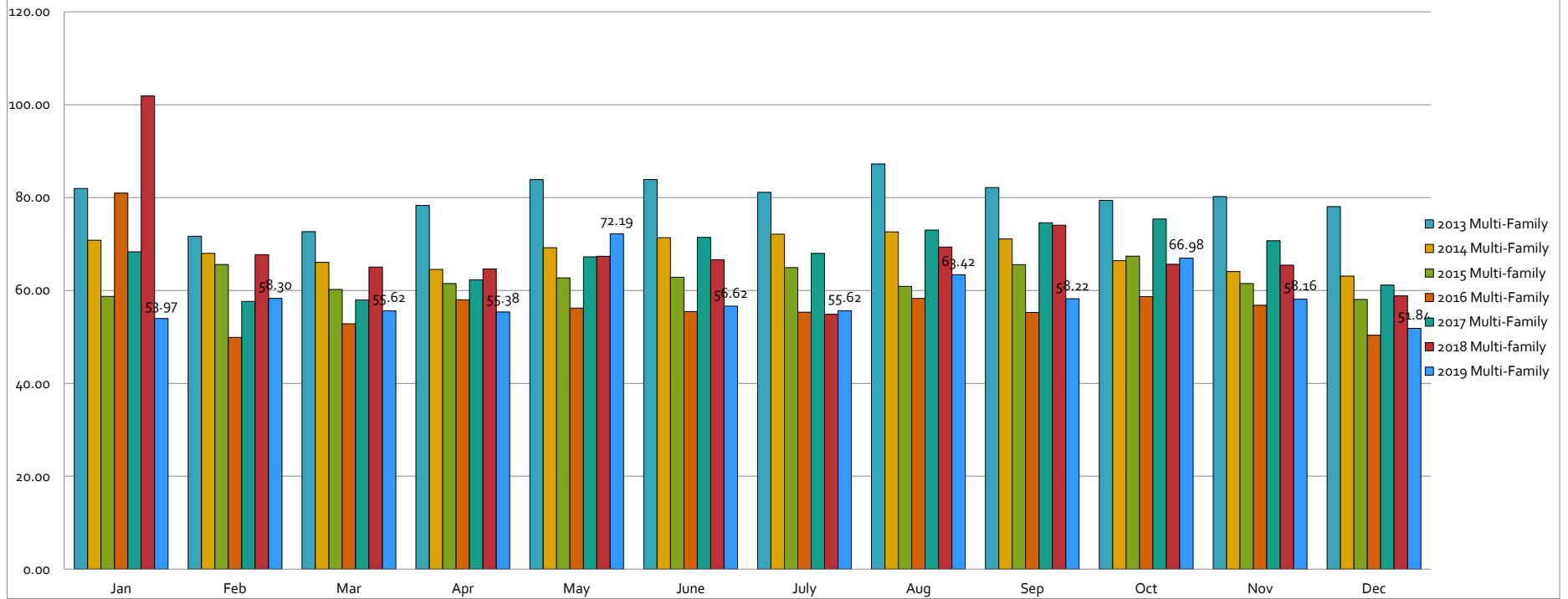




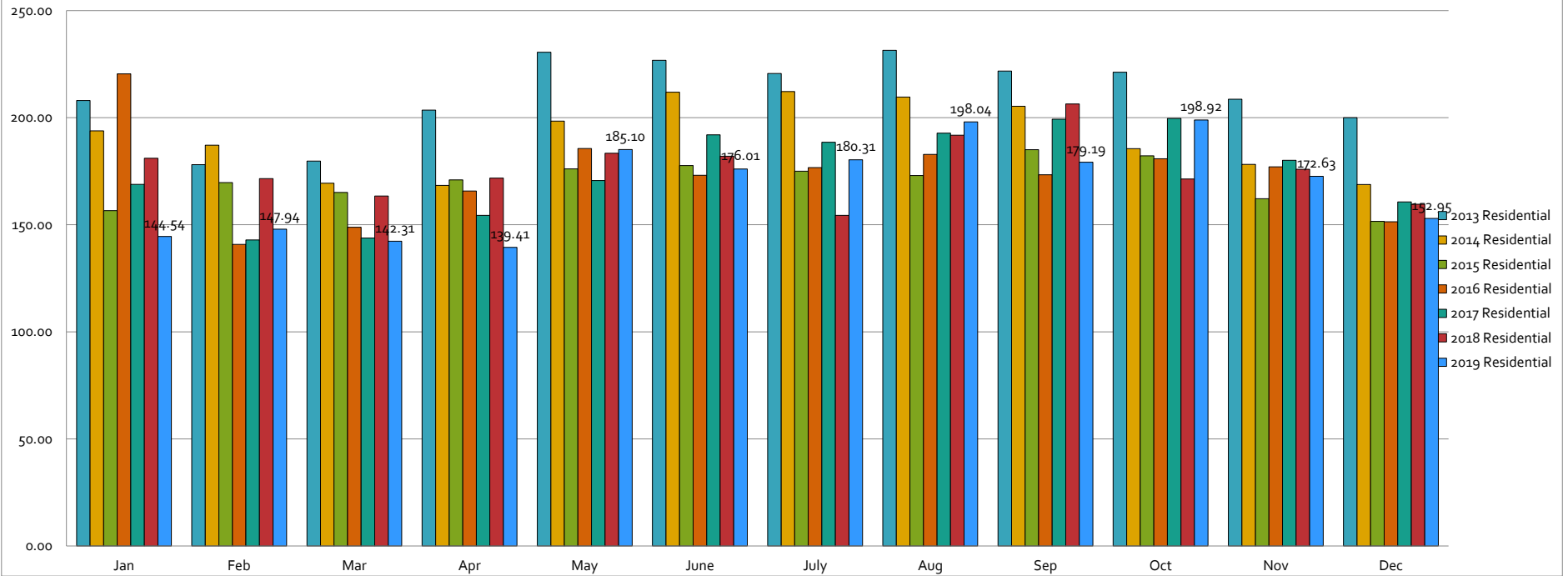
2013-2019 Single Family Consumption by Month (Acre-Feet)



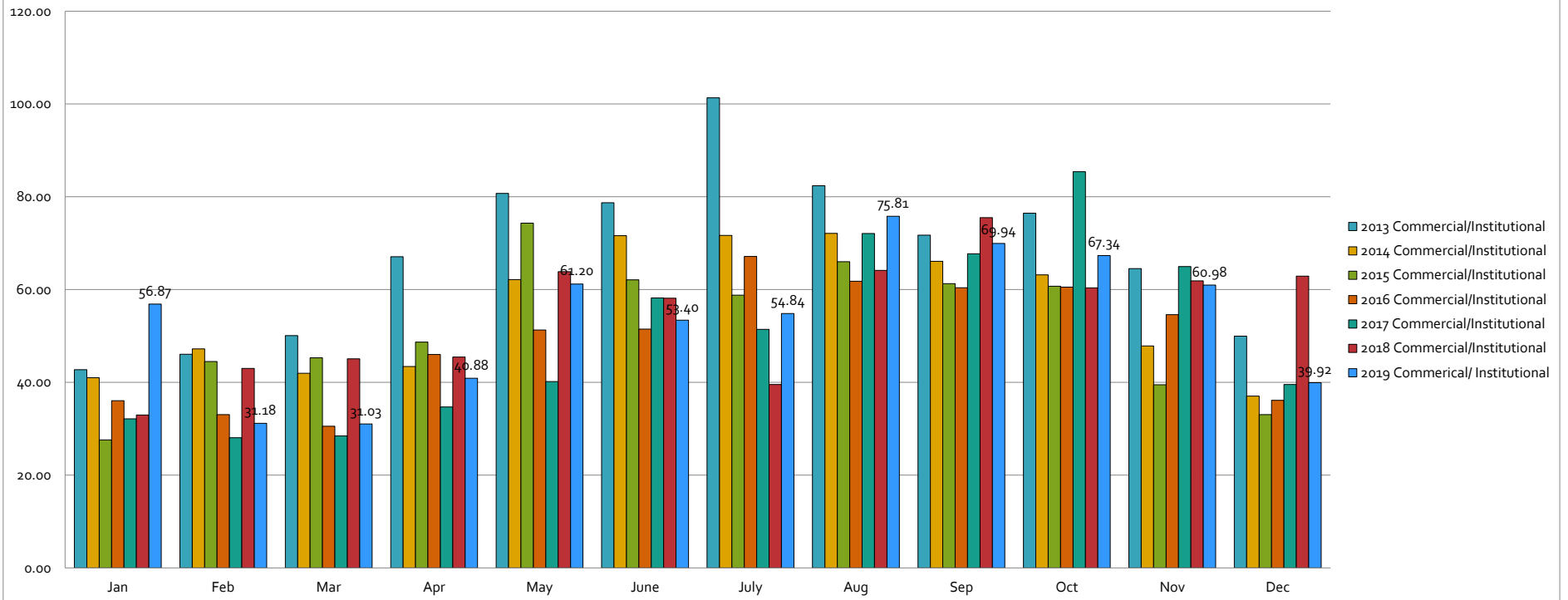
2013-2019 Multi-Family Total Consumption by Month (Acre-Feet)



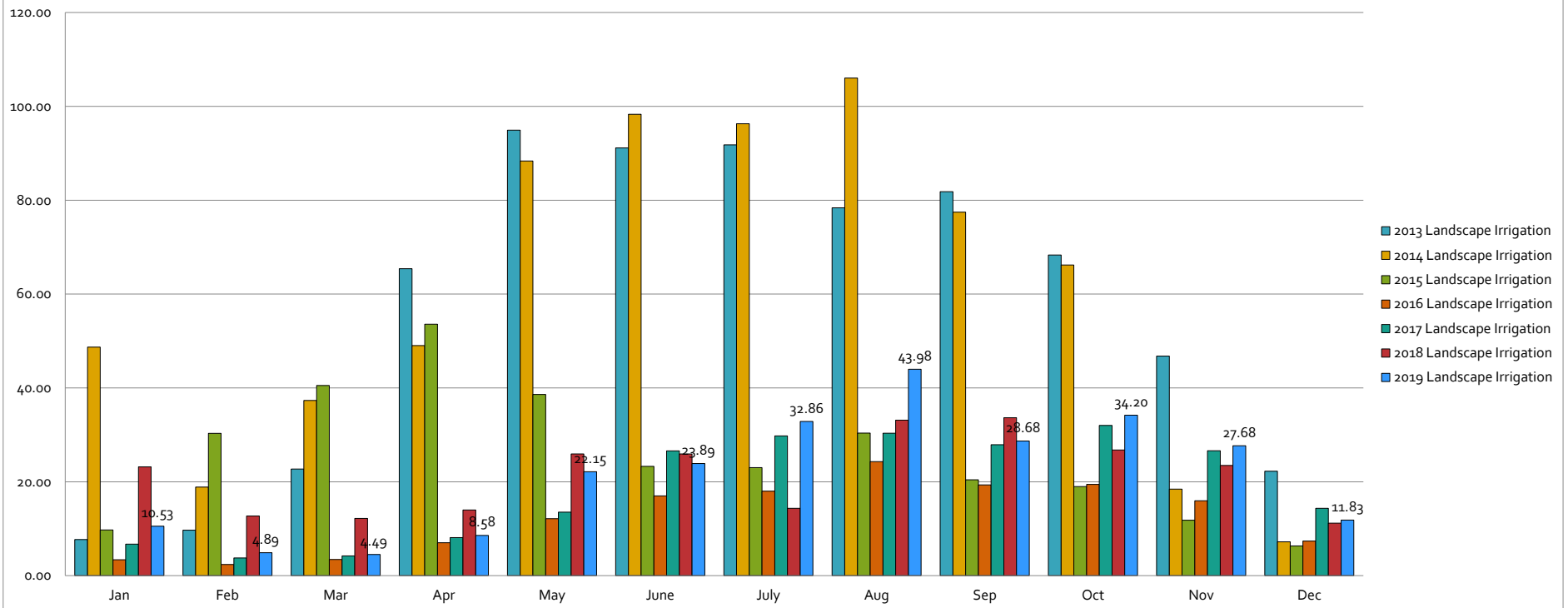
2013-2019 Residential Total Consumption by Month (Acre-Feet)
(Single-Family and Multi-family Combined)



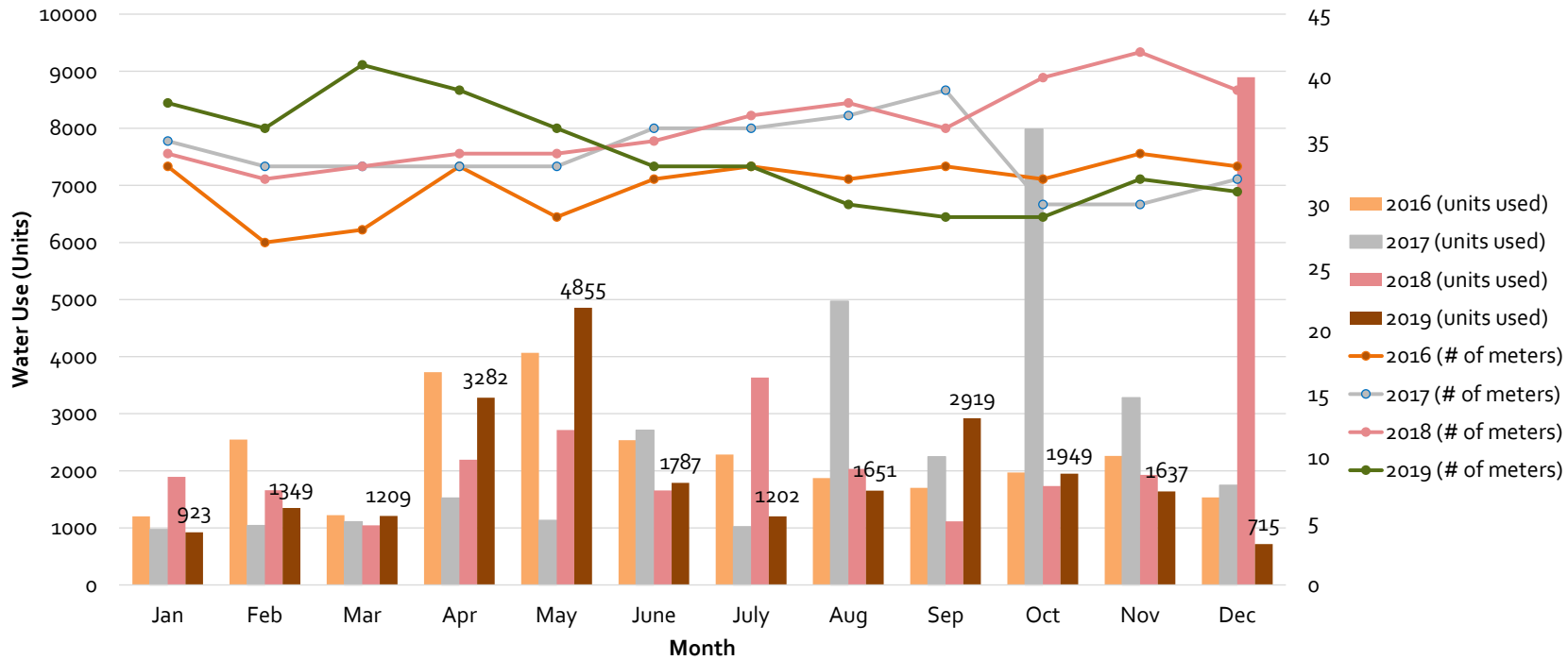
2013-2019 Commercial/Institutional Consumption by Month (Acre-Feet)



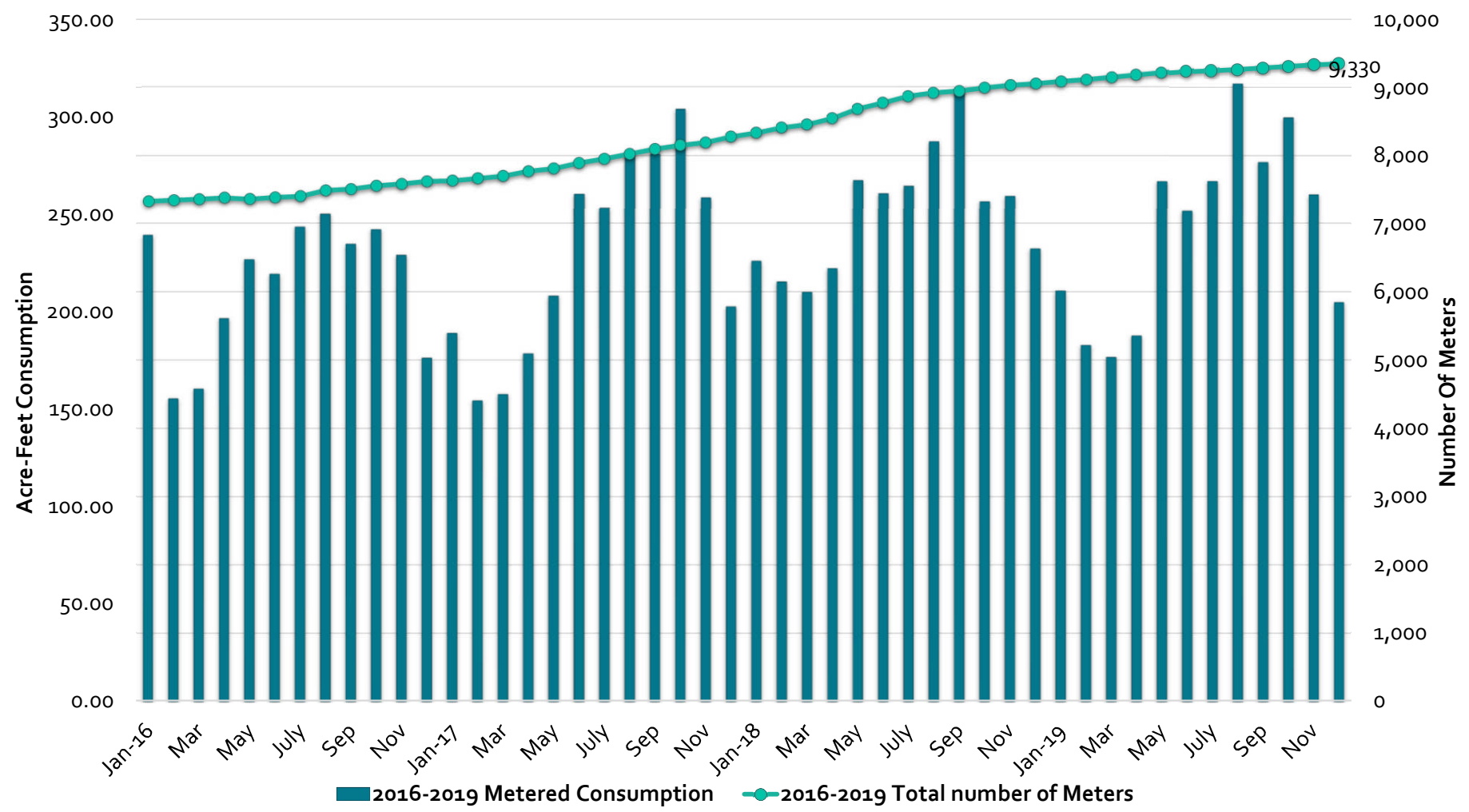
2013-2019 Landscape Irrigation Consumption by Month (Acre-Feet)



2016-2019 Total Temporary Hydrant Meter Water Use and # of Meters

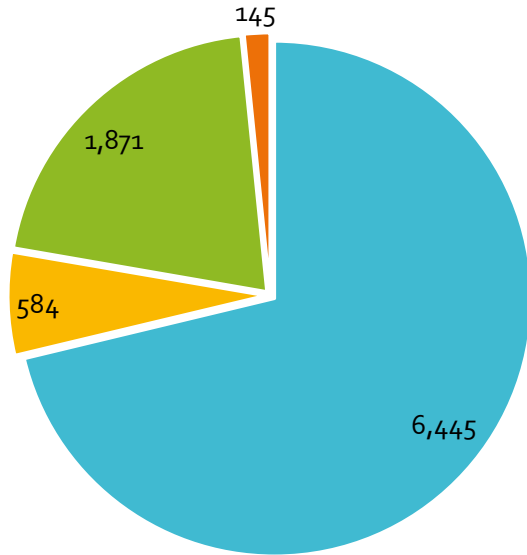


2016 - 2019 Active Meter Count vs. Metered Consumption in Acre-Feet



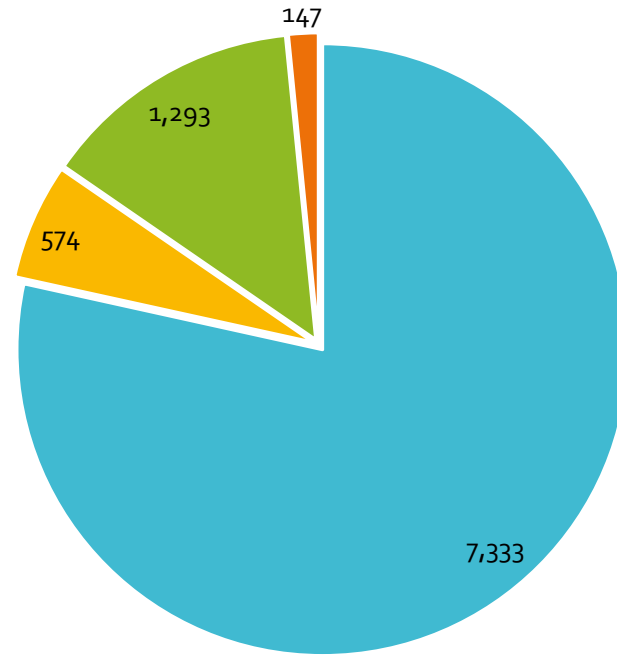
